Over the past nine months, our school has transitioned temporarily to remote learning and back, raised funds for purchasing laptops to equip our students, endured a change in leadership, lost revenue from cancelled fundraising events, welcomed new part-time faculty, and prepared for quick pivots in response to the pandemic. With a total staff of just two and a half, we have accomplished the near-impossible.

Though tumultuous, the past several months have also been edifying. They have confirmed the value of student-centered, in-person education, reminding us of just how lucky we are to be able to learn together while larger schools around us have been forced to close their doors. These months have also prompted us to redefine our very mission, considering more intentionally what makes EBS unique and what we want to offer the NEK.
